Best Practices



- A. Empowering Faith Leaders to <u>Lead COVID-19</u> <u>Messages of Hope initiatives</u> creates message acceptance and change to behaviour among the target audiences.
- B. Recording <u>appeal messages</u> by the Faith Leaders drawn from the COVID-19 Messages of Hope creates message impact.
- C. <u>Connecting Media platforms with the Faith</u> <u>Leaders</u> in the fight against COVID-19 through the Messages of Hope has contributed to the MOH efforts.

Key Lessons



- Engaging Faith Leaders in the fight against COVID-19 creates an <u>easy connection</u> with their followers to support the fight against COVID-19.
- 2. Messages developed in the <u>local language</u> are easily taken up.
- 3. <u>Graphical illustrations</u> as opposed to the real photographs of faith Leaders is a better option to attain message impact.
- 4. <u>Create more time to continue engaging the</u> <u>Faith leaders</u> to engage their followers more especially on vaccination for COVID-19.

Challenges & solutions



<u>1.Reluctant uptake of COVID-19 Vaccines, 2.Stigmatising</u> <u>victims of COVID-19, 3.Complacency among the target</u> <u>audience</u>

Solutions:

- Continuous awareness creation among the target audience through the Faith Leaders.
- Continuous knowledge sharing and support by Medical Doctors on the platforms to provide medically sound responses to questions to manage stigma, myth and misconceptions.
- Faith Leaders taking lead in mobilisation and vaccination sessions through media engagements and outreach activities.

Next Actions



- Continuous Media engagement by the Faith Leaders.
- Tracking impact of activities
- Strategic update and alignment meetings led by MOH.
- Conduct outreach activities led by Faith Leaders to increase uptake of vaccination as per current MOH Target
